COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

May 5, 2022

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

Energy Services Program - Last week, City staff and representatives from ENGIE Services US Inc. ("ENGIE") met to officially kick off the program development plan and initiation of the Energy Services Program assessment of City properties and facilities. ENGIE has requested preliminary information which staff has either already provided or are currently preparing in advance of the upcoming site surveys, which are anticipated to begin next week. Ongoing coordination during this initial phase of the project will be centralized through the City Manager's Office.

PLANNING

General Plan Update Phase 2 – The Planning Division will bring to the Planning Commission (5/23) and City Council (6/22) revised project alternatives for the General Plan, all of which assume no change to current housing allowances in South Morro Hills (SMH). The planning effort for SMH will continue to move forward as a separate project, initially refocused on the potential for robust agritourism in the area.

ENGINEERING

The Strand Overlay
Project – The contractor
began grinding and asphalt
paving work for Seagaze,
Wisconsin, and S. The
Strand this week. Asphalt
paving is expected to be
completed this week. Curb
replacement on the seawall
and striping are scheduled
over the next two weeks.





Pier View Way Bridge and Lifeguard Headquarters – A conference call between City and local Coastal Commission staff is scheduled for this week to further discuss the project permitting requirements and potential design options.

Beachfront Improvement Feasibility Study Phase II – City Council briefings on Option Development were completed this week. An Option Development public outreach meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, May 25 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. in the Civic Center Library Community Rooms. The study website was updated with new information and additional future meetings dates.

Cleveland Storm Drain - The consultant continues design of the sewer pump station that is required for a private sewer lateral currently in conflict with the proposed storm drain design. The project's Coastal Development Permit is tentatively scheduled for consideration at the August Coastal Commission meeting.

Buccaneer Park Project – A community meeting was held on May 3 for presentation of the <u>preferred concept plan</u>. The concept will also be presented at the Parks and Recreation Commission meeting on Tuesday, May 17, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. More information.

PUBLIC WORKS

Harbor Dredge Update - Manson Construction has been pumping sand south of the Pier for several days. As of Tuesday, May 3, approximately 133,000 cubic yards of sand has been deposited on City beaches. Several additional safety measures, including additional fencing and field observers have been added this week. Grunion monitoring has found a high volume of activity on our beaches. Additionally, large 15-foot swells are anticipated Monday, May 9. The dredge pipe located under the pier will be removed in anticipation of the large swells in order to protect the public and pilings supporting the pier. Manson Construction anticipates dredging approximately 250,000 cubic yards of sand during this dredge cycle.

FIRE

Wildland Training Burns - The Oceanside Fire Department will be conducting wildland training burns starting May 10 and continuing for several days through the end of May. All of the burns will be north of Hwy 76. Citizens may see smoke from these training fires, but Fire Department personnel will be on scene doing the ignition and extinguishment. These burns are conducted both to provide training to firefighters in advance of the upcoming wildland fire season, and also to remove non-native grasses from



areas where organizations are trying to return to a more natural vegetation state. In the event a citizen sees a fire with no fire department personnel present, or one that is south of Hwy 76, they are asked to call 911 immediately. WATER UTILITIES

Encampment and Litter Abatement Clean Up Services - Over the past year, the Water Utilities Department worked collaboratively with Waste Management (WM) to identify and reallocate underutilized service value credit from the current Franchise Agreement. As a result of this effort, WM finalized a contract of \$174,500 with Urban Corp of San Diego to provide as needed encampment and litter abatement services to the City. Clean up efforts will begin next week and will continue through this contract until funds have been expended.

Oceanside Awarded MWD Regional Rebate Program Grant - The City has been awarded a California Regionwide Water Conservation Program grant for just under \$31,000 for leak detection activities. The grant was received from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD), which funds the Municipal Leak Detection and Repair Grant Program. This funding will be used to supplement leak detection activities within the City's drinking water distribution system. The City will collaborate with the San Diego County Water Authority and other local water systems to take advantage of economies of scale and leverage significant cost savings. Utilizing satellite technology, potential water system leaks will be identified within the City and investigated further for repair. This grant funding will allow for 615 miles of leak detection to occur.

Quarterly Neighborhood Cleanup – Green Oceanside, Neighborhood Services, and Code Enforcement are hosting a Quarterly Neighborhood Cleanup on Saturday, May 21, 2022, from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Residents can dispose of materials beyond reuse and repair, such as furniture, home goods, mattresses, etc. Construction, demolition and electronic recycling will also be available. Alternatively, a re-use organization will be onsite to accept donations of gently-used items. Community members can also help remove litter and debris from the neighborhood and park area. Gloves, bags, and other cleanup supplies will be available for use at the Green Oceanside booth. HOUSING & NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES

Mobile Home Park Rent - The park owner of Laguna Vista Mobile Estates has filed an application with the City Clerk's office for a Net Operating Income (NOI) Rent Adjustment for their park. The park owners are seeking a 26.67% increase in rent rather than the annual permissive rent increase for 2022 at 3.9%. Residents of the park were provided a copy of the application and the City provided a letter to residents explaining the NOI rent adjustment process and next steps. At this time, City staff are reviewing the application for completeness. Once staff has completed a review, a meeting of the Manufactured Home Fair Practices Commission will be scheduled and all residents, the park owner and representatives, and other interested parties will be notified.
