

# COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

May 19, 2022

## PLANNING

**General Plan Update Phase 2** – General Plan Update Phase 2 project alternatives will be presented to the Planning Commission and the City Council on May 23 and June 22, respectively. The Alternatives Report is posted on the [project webpage](#). Following selection of a preferred plan, the project team will begin preparing updated General Plan elements, drafts of which are anticipated to be made available for public review in the fall of this year.

**Cannabis Update** – Finance staff has been working with the City's cannabis consultant, HdL, to start the first round of business audits on operating businesses.

**Buena Vista Lagoon Joint Powers Committee (BVL JPC) Meeting** - The BVL JPC met on May 16 in the City of Carlsbad. The Committee heard an update from the Cattail Control Ad-hoc Committee. CA Fish and Wildlife has been meeting with local property owners to determine areas with the greatest need for vector control. CA Fish and Wildlife has also conducted surveys to determine location of Ridgway's Rail to ensure the bird and its habitat are not impacted during removal of cattails. The Committee also directed staff to further research options for virtual meetings.

## ENGINEERING

**Street Overlay Project** – The contractor completed new concrete curb and manhole replacements on the Measure X-funded South Strand repaving project this week. Final work includes pavement markings, which are anticipated to be complete by May 27.

**Beachfront Improvement Feasibility Study Phase II** – The City is commencing the "Option Development Phase" of the feasibility study with the next community outreach meeting scheduled for Wednesday, May 25 from 6:30 - 8:30 p.m. in the Civic Center Library Community Rooms. The public is invited to review and comment on some of the potential improvement options generated from this outreach process. For more information, please refer to [the flyer](#).

**College Blvd. Widening from Barnard Dr. / Waring Rd. to Old Grove Rd.** – The consultant completed the existing utility plan that will be used to develop the new roadway design. Final roadway cross section designs will be provided next week for review and approval. A coordination meeting will be held the first week of June with representatives from Ranch Maintenance District to coordinate the design and minimize potential impacting HOA improvements.

**Cleveland Storm Drain Project** – The consultant continued design of the sewer pump station. The California Coastal Commission has set a tentative hearing for August to approve the City permit application for the beach outfall.

**Buccaneer Park Project** – Staff presented the final concept plan to the Parks and Recreation Committee on May 17.

**Brooks Street ADA Project** – The Notice of Award was sent out to Tri-Group Construction and Development, Inc. along with the contract documents.

**Public Works Week** –National Public Works Week was celebrated with a group photo at the City Operations Center this week, along with some social media appreciation to thank the Oceanside team, which includes Maintenance/Operations, Harbor, Traffic Engineering, Fleet, Property Management, and Administrative staff.



## PUBLIC WORKS

**Harbor Dredge Update** - Manson Construction met the contract amount of 245,000 cubic yards of sand dredged as of Friday evening, May 13. They continued to dredge until Saturday, May 14 at 2:30 p.m. The final dredged amount will be announced at a later date. The dredge vessel departed the Harbor on Sunday, May 15. On Monday, May 16, pipeline south of the Pier was removed. On Tuesday, pipeline west of North Coast Village (NCV) and at the mouth of the San Luis Rey was removed. On Wednesday, pipeline between NCV and the Pier was removed. Heavy equipment will be operating on the beach for several more days. Demobilization of all equipment should be complete by Wednesday, May 25.

**Oceanside Fleet Award** – Oceanside's Fleet was once again named a "100 Best Fleet" in 2022 by NAFA Fleet Management Association, the world's largest association for those who manage the vehicular fleet and mobility responsibilities for their employers. Congratulations to Fleet Manager Kenny Buom and his team.

**Primary Election** - The Civic Center and Mission Branch Libraries will serve as official mail ballot drop-off locations for the 2022 Statewide Direct Primary Election from Monday, May 9 through Tuesday, June 7. Signed, sealed, and dated mail ballot envelopes can be dropped off during regular Civic Center and Mission Branch Library hours.
