#### **COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE**

June 3, 2021

#### **PLANNING**

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission will review at its meeting on Monday, June 7, 2021.

**MORRIS ADDITION –** Consideration of a REGULAR COASTAL PERMIT (RC20-00012) request to allow the demolition of an existing 224-square foot unpermitted room and construction of a 592-square foot single-story addition with a 174-square foot attached, ground-level deck to an existing single-family residence, located at 2115 South Tremont Street. **Staff is recommending approval.** 

**EMERGENCY SHELTER ZONE AMENDMENT** – Consideration of a ZONE AMENDMENT (ZA21-00003) to introduce an ordinance amending Zoning Ordinance Articles 4, 11, 13, 16 and 30 regarding Emergency Shelters. The proposed language would remove zoning barriers and remove the Conditional Use Permit requirement for emergency shelters located along Oceanside Boulevard and on certain City of Oceanside owned properties in the Commercial, Industrial, and Public/Semi-Public Zones and would amend the Public/Semi Public Zone to allow City of Oceanside government offices as a permitted use without discretionary action. **Staff is recommending City Council approval.** 

HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATE - Consideration of a GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT (GPA21-00002) to update the City's Housing Element for the 2021-2029 planning period as mandated by state law. Housing Element law requires that local governments plan to meet the existing and projected housing needs of all economic segments of the community. The Housing Element includes an assessment of current and future housing needs, an analysis of constraints to the production and preservation of housing, an inventory of land resources available for housing development, and an outline of programs designed to reduce barriers to and enhance opportunities for meeting the City's housing needs. The City was assigned a Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) of 5,443 units at four income levels (Very Low, Low, Moderate, and Above Moderate). While current zoning within the City's major commercial corridors allows for mixed-use development with residential densities up to 29 dwelling units per acre, the Housing Element Update (HEU) includes an action plan to promote new goals and policies and housing programs to spur infill and redevelopment in these areas. Through implementation of the housing programs, potential housing sites were identified in the Sites Inventory to show the City's ability to accommodate its RHNA allocation. Specifically, the HEU identifies that with upzoning, there are sufficient housing sites to accommodate its share of affordable housing through its inventory of potential housing sites located within smart growth opportunity areas which are transit-oriented, walkable, and served by adequate infrastructure. Staff is recommending City Council approval.

# **ENGINEERING**

**Buccaneer Park (Project Study Report)** – The City's consultant, KTUA, has prepared a public outreach survey that will soon be released to the public. KTUA also performed a site assessment last week. Public outreach continues with South Oceanside community members.

## **LIBRARY**

## **PUBLIC WORKS**

Harbor Small Fishing Pier - Brady and Associates have been performing inspections of all Harbor structures to assess conditions. The recent inspection of the small fishing pier identified some deficiencies. It was determined that the occupancy should be limited (10 people max.) while temporary repairs are made. The pier will need to be replaced in the near future and staff will begin researching grant opportunities for design and replacement.

**Vandegrift Boulevard Repairs -** Public Works staff made roadway repairs to the #2 southbound lane on Vandegrift Boulevard from Granite Place to East Parker Street this week.

## **WATER UTILITIES**

City Passes CalRecycle 2016-2019 Jurisdiction Review — After a lengthy three-year inspection and review process, California's Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) concluded that Oceanside's Solid Waste and Recycling Program meets compliance for multiple state laws, including AB 939 and AB 1826, as well as other mandated programming. Out of 381 cities reviewed, Oceanside was one of 203 cities that passed, with the remaining 178 cities being placed on compliance orders due to major deficiencies.
