COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

May 9, 2024

PLANNING

Brother Benno's Conditional Use Permit – The 11th coordination meeting between the Industrial Business Park, Brother Bennos, City staff, and OPD took place on May 9. Topics discussed included progress reports and OPD activities/incidents, updates on cost sharing opportunities for enhanced security, and an update on the proposed Safe Parking lot and potential area parking restrictions.

Lagoon Pacific at South O - Staff recently received an application for a Tentative Map, Development Plan and Density Bonus application for 36 single-family detached homes located at 1501 Kelly Street. The project, which is located in the Fire Mountain Neighborhood Planning Area, includes six homes set aside as affordable units (three for low-income and three for moderate-income). The homes range in size from 1,680



SF to 2,360 SF and would include a two-car garage. The project is currently under initial review by City staff.

Olive Park Apartments - Staff is reviewing a Development Plan/Density Bonus application for a 100% affordable housing project located at the terminus of Olive Drive, just south of the College Blvd. Sprinter Station. The project would include up to 282 multi-family units. A public scoping meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 9 at 6:00 p.m. at the El Corazon Events Center to discuss the project and obtain information regarding the content and scope of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) that must be prepared for the project. The applicant will host a community outreach meeting to further discuss the proposed project with the public on Thursday, May 23 at 6:00 p.m. at the El Corazon Conference & Events Center.



Planning Commission – The following action was taken by the Planning Commission at its May 6 meeting:

- Motion to adopt PC Resolution 2024-P-10 relating to the CIP Budget FY 2024/25 (draft document) was approved with a vote of 4-0 (Rosales, Malik, Dodds - absent)
- The next regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting is Monday, May 20 at 6:00 p.m.

Oceanside Historic Preservation Advisory Commission (OHPAC) – The next regularly scheduled OHPAC meeting is Tuesday, July 16 at 6:00 p.m.

ENGINEERING

Road Slurry Seal & Overlay Project – (Work Area Map):

- Remaining work on Vista Way to be completed by end of week to include utility raising and traffic loop installation.
- Project wide, all contract work completed. The Notice of Completion has been sent to the County for processing and filing.

Cleveland Storm Drain –Staff is continuing to resolve several pending design coordination issues so the project can be put out to bid as soon as possible. Staff continues to work with California Coastal Commission (CCC) staff to address the design parameters for storm drain catch basins and the outfall structure..

Full Capture Device Installation Rd 3 – The third year of storm drain trash capture device installation began on March 25. The installation wrapped up on May 3, with 51 devices added across various locations in the City. These devices are required to comply with state laws and will require several more rounds of installation to comply.

Library Courtyard Improvements – The contractor continues installing concrete forms and rebar for the stage and bench. The benches are expected to be poured on Friday, May 17.

CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

Pier Reopening - About 80 percent of the Pier will reopen on Friday, May 10 at 7:00 a.m. The reopened area will extend beyond the Bait Shop, the restrooms, and the fish washing station at the last "offset." The damaged far end of the Pier will remain fenced off until further notice. The fence will include a banner with QR code to scan for additional pier-related information, including information related to the on-going Harbor dredging project as people may see heavy equipment and outfall pipe while there.

Turf Replacement Program Incentive Increase – Grant funding, including a US Bureau of Reclamation award to the City of Oceanside, has been added to existing rebates to increase the rebate amount for residential, commercial and public agency customers to transform landscape from natural turf grass into one that uses less water,

supports the local ecosystem, and helps minimize storm water runoff. Rebates start at \$2-\$3 per square foot. See socalwatersmart.com to estimate your rebate, for other details, and to apply.
