COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

December 24, 2020

<u>PLANNING</u>

CARMAX - The Project has been deemed complete and the Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) is currently in its required 45-day public review period (December 18, 2020 - February 1, 2021). The project is anticipated to be scheduled for a public hearing by the Planning Commission at the end of February or early March, depending on the scope of comments received on the DEIR.

ENGINEERING

Quiet Zone Update – The revised application for the Notice of Intent has been reviewed by NCTD and signed by the City Engineer for submission to the Federal Railroad Administration. The foundations for the Mission/Myers traffic signal poles will be poured this week.

Overlay Project –The work associated with the various overlay locations, and the Rancho Hermosa and Industry Street area full-depth reclamations are substantially complete with only punch list items that remain. Work for Mission Avenue between I-5 and Horne Street requires a Caltrans encroachment permit. The project is awaiting this approved encroachment permit in order to commence construction.

San Ramon/Rancho Del Oro Traffic Signal – The striping and pavement markers were completed on December 16. The traffic signal was also energized and placed on red flash for a period of one week to increase awareness of the new signal. The traffic signal will be set to its normal cycle this week. Pending completion of minor punch list items, the project will be complete.

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES

Food Distribution for Youth - The Neighborhood Services team helped distribute meals on Tuesday to Oceanside Unified School District youth and will continue throughout the Winter Break. Times and locations for this program, as well as Boys & Girls Club and Vista Community Clinic distributions are listed on the City website and have been shared on social media.





New Sports Guidance - With the recently released guidance from the Department of Public Health regarding youth and adult recreational sports, Parks and Recreation staff are working with all Oceanside sports groups to ensure they are able to obtain compliance and to answer any questions they may have in order to be able to return to play at the earliest possible opportunity. Additionally, staff is preparing to bring back our internal programing such as recreation softball and soccer leagues when the appropriate tier is reached. Staff is anticipating additional information with respect to this newly released guidance and how the return of High School sports will impact our facilities and operations.

E-Sports Tournament - The Parks and Recreation Division is hosting its first ever FORTNITE E-Sports Tournament on Friday, January 15 from 7:00-9:00 p.m. Staff have partnered with Game Sync Gaming Center to run the tournament and provide live commentary and interviews throughout the tournament. Participants will use their personal devices/consoles to participate from the comfort of their own homes. Prizes will be distributed and will include trophies, game vouchers, and more.



WATER UTILITIES

Oceanside Blvd. Lift Station - The Grading Permit has been received since the project's plans and erosion control plan were updated. The contractor returned to the site in December 2020 to implement Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan updates and clean the project site. Construction is scheduled to restart on Monday January 4, 2021.

Holiday Tree Recycling – Holiday trees will be collected curbside for three weeks following December 25 on regular collection days. Trees should be cut in half and placed in the green waste cart with lid closed, or be set adjacent to the green waste cart. Oceanside residents may also drop off holiday trees at the El Corazon Compost Facility (3210 Oceanside Blvd.) during open hours, to be recycled. All tree stands and decorations must be removed before collection. Flocked trees may not be recycled, and must be disposed of through regular landfill service.
