PLANNING

Listed below are the Public Hearing items that the Planning Commission reviewed and acted on at their meeting on Monday, March 11, 2019.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

VILA MASSAGE – Consideration of a CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP18-00022) and WAIVER OF LOCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR REGULATED USES to allow the operation of a massage therapy business within an existing approximately 1,800-square foot tenant suite located at 1816 Oceanside Blvd., Suite B (Frazier Farms Marketplace Center). ***The Commission adopted the Resolution by a 5-1 vote (Goodkind – No), recommending City council approval***

PUBLIC WORKS

Harbor Dredging Update - The Army Corps of Engineers advertised the annual maintenance dredging project on Feb 19 and the proposal deadline is March 21. Dependent on the number of proposals received, they anticipate the review period to last two weeks, and then award the project soon after. The intent is to start work in late April/early May and complete the work by Memorial Day Weekend.

WATER UTILITIES

Recycling in the News - National media outlets have recently reported on new contamination standards for recycled materials set by China. In Oceanside, in partnership with Waste Management (WM), staff continues to provide education to the public about proper ways to recycle. In recent years, in large part due to our Zero Waste programming, Oceanside has had some of the lowest contamination levels in the County for recycling. WM processing systems in CA. are state of the art, and vary significantly by locale and state. Our contract with WM requires the hauler to maintain a certain level of recycling/diversion levels, and as a result, WM is committed to processing our materials, and improving upon the recycling centers to ensure loads can get processed even with stricter standards. WM has also been instrumental in providing education to the community, with the most recent "Recycle Right" newsletter being sent to all Oceanside households through direct mail. Other strategies to limit this issue is our Zero Waste reduction campaigns and efforts towards limiting single-use packaging materials in the community, businesses, and special events, and to always buy recycled content products in order to drive recycling markets.

Statewide Recycling Center closures and challenges facing California's bottle bill redemption system - Oceanside's curbside recycling program and Buyback Recycling Center, in partnership with Waste Management (WM), continues to be successful with increased participation throughout the community. Recent media reports have detailed statewide issues associated with Recycling Center closures, and California's Redemption Value (CRV) deposit program. These issues are more relative to recycling centers in rural areas, and for legislative reform for the CRV program, as the State's program has had difficulty with antiquated funding mechanisms, ineffective authorization strategies, and fraud. Oceanside currently remains insulated from these issues, as our contractual partnership with WM guarantees the availability of curbside recycling services and the Buyback Recycling Center. Furthermore, our programs are not dependent on the Statewide program, and as a result, are not susceptible to the closures and challenges facing other communities.

District-wide Zero Waste Schools Program near complete - Oceanside's Zero Waste Schools Program is near complete with implementation activities currently occurring at the district's last three schools: Garrison Elementary, San Luis Rey Elementary, and North Terrace K-8. Since the adoption of the City's Zero Waste Resolution and Zero Waste Strategic Resource Management Plan, the City's Green Oceanside team has worked with each and every school in the Oceanside Unified School District to achieve at minimum a 50-75% recycling rate. The program has realized cost savings for the school district through reduced disposal costs, increased diversion rates on all campuses, has led to the complete elimination of polystyrene foam food trays at schools, and has further empowered student leaders and staff to make significant changes for sustainability and zero waste within their daily lives at home, work, and at school.
