CITY COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE April 13, 2017

Planning

The Planning Division will host a community meeting to gather public input on proposed revisions to the Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) ordinance that are being mandated by recent State legislation. ADUs provide housing for family members, students and the elderly, and also reduce commute times and greenhouse gases. The proposed revisions are intended to balance the provision of ADUs as affordable housing as mandated by the State while protecting neighborhoods by requiring State regulations that are optional. The Housing Element calls for the City to encourage ADUs and to process zoning amendments to assure compliance with State law. The community meeting is scheduled on **April 17** at 6:00 in the Library Community Meeting Room.

Harbor

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Dredging Project – The dredging contractor, Manson Construction has already buried the dredge pipe on Harbor Beach and is awaiting the arrival of the remainder of the steel dredge pipe needed. Their dredging work will commence on Monday, as their dredge is now here. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (USACE) survey vessel has begun their survey of the Harbor Entrance and we are waiting for the conclusion of the pre-dredge surveys conducted by Manson and USACE. The result of the survey will determine the actual amount of additional sand that can be dredged.

Public Works

USACE San Luis Rey River Sign Project – The USACE will begin installing "No Trespassing" signs along both sides of the San Luis Rey River levee on April 21. The project will start on the north side of the river at College Boulevard and move west. The work will then continue on the south side of the river at College Boulevard and move west. The bike path will remain open during construction but may have to be closed temporarily for a short period of time on the south side of the river, west of Interstate 5. Approximately 300 signs total will be installed on the land side and river side of the river every 1000 feet. The project is expected to take 3-4 months and work will be done by Corps staff on the weekends (Friday through Sunday).

Water Utilities

El Corazon Food Recovery Kitchen and Culinary Arts Training Institute - Staff is preparing to distribute a Request for Quotation/Proposal for the design, build, and option to operate the El Corazon Food Recovery Kitchen and Culinary Arts Training Institute. City staff is also working collaboratively with Planning, Engineering, and Parks and Recreation to ensure that the final kitchen facility meets and complements storage needs, event catering use, and future recreational development goals at the Center. Additional funding has been requested in the FY18 Budget, in order to accommodate the expanding services of the facility. City staff are also actively seeking grant funding opportunities to support the eventual operation of the center and

its overall zero waste food recovery goals. Project completion is expected to take at minimum another 18 months.
