#### CITY COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

## **Planning**

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission reviewed and took action on at their meeting on Monday, May 22, 2017.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

PREMIERE PATIO PROPANE – Consideration of a CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TIME EXTENSION (CUP14-00010TE2017) to allow the operation and storage of a 30,000-gallon propane tank for an existing propane business located at 3231-B Oceanside Boulevard. *The Commission approved the time extension and adopted the resolution by a 7-0 vote. The call for review/appeal period ends on June 1, 2017.* 

CIRCULATION ELEMENT UPDATE – Consideration of a GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT (GPA17-00001) to allow changes to the City's Circulation Element, which includes the City's goals, objectives, and policies relative to the maintenance and improvement of the City's transportation systems. The proposed changes principally involve the removal of two extensions of Melrose Avenue and removal of a new interchange at State Highway 76 and Rancho Del Oro Road, based on the Council's prior direction. The Planning Commission will make recommendations to the City Council, which will render a final determination on the project. The proposed General Plan Amendment would apply citywide, including within the Coastal Zone and the Downtown Redevelopment Area, although the proposed amendments do not involve physical changes to the transportation system within the Coastal Zone. *The Commission adopted the resolution considering the Circulation Element EIR Addendum; and resolution recommending Council approval by a 4-3 vote (Balma, Busk, Balch – No)*.

ZONE AMENDMENT ARTICLES (14 A-Agricultural, 17 PD-Planned Development and 19 MHP-Mobile Home Park) — Consideration of ZONE AMENDMENT (ZA17-00002) modifying Articles 14, 17 and 19 of the City's 1992 Zoning Ordinance, to update references to decision-making bodies, City departments and management staff titles to reflect changes which have resulted due to internal City reorganization. *The Commission adopted the resolution by a 7-0 vote, recommending Council approval.* 

### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

- General Plan Conformity Finding for CIP Projects. *The Commission adopted the resolution by a 7-0 vote, determining the CIP is in conformance with the General Plan.*
- Cancellation of June 12, 2017 Meeting. Item discussed

## **Fire Department**

Lifeguard agencies along the coast, through the work of the California Marine Safety Chiefs Association (San Diego County, Orange County and LA County), have worked diligently to issue **Standard Operating Shark Incident & Sighting Guidelines**. Steps are in place to monitor shark activity and beach closure, if necessary. Oceanside beaches will remain open unless sharks are sighted swimming near shore and/or swimmers.

### **Harbor**

**U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Harbor Dredging Project** – To date, Manson Construction has dredged 292,000 cubic yards of sand and the discharge pipe is currently placing sand south of the pier. Production has been extremely high this past week with good conditions. The contractor will not be working Memorial Day weekend and will store some pipe and equipment just south of the pier in a secure location, so they can resume work early Tuesday morning after the holiday. They have been given permission to extend their permit and continue dredging operations until June 12<sup>th</sup>.
