Planning

Planning Commission

The July 24 Planning Commission meeting is cancelled.

Engineering

The Draft Environmental Impact (DEIR) Report for the Coast Highway Corridor Study has been released for a 45-day public review period starting on July 13 through August 28. Water Utilities

Bureau of Reclamation WIIN Funding -The Water Utilities Department was notified that the Mission Basin Indirect Potable Reuse (IPR) Project as well as the North San Diego County Water Reuse Coalition were two of 38 projects submitted to Congress and approved to compete for Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (WIIN) funding opportunities. Under the current offering, \$10 million is available and the Bureau of Reclamation is anticipated to make 4-8 awards, depending on funding requests. Eligible projects must reclaim and reuse municipal, industrial, domestic or agricultural wastewater and impaired ground or surface waters. Oceanside will be working with Olivenhain Water staff to complete a regional application for construction funding, due to the Bureau of Reclamation on August 17, 2017. The application will include a funding request for portions of Oceanside's recycled water system. Oceanside's IPR project is currently undergoing geotechnical and permitting work and is anticipated to replenish the Mission Basin aquifer with up to 5 million gallons per day of highly treated recycled water, capable of sustaining the yield of the basin. An application for the Oceanside IPR project will be submitted next year so that construction components can be included in the application for the best chance of being selected for award.
