Planning

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission reviewed and took action on at their meeting on Monday, October 23, 2017.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

GRANDVIEW POINTE — Consideration of a TENTATIVE TRACT MAP (T15-00006), DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D15-00013) and DENSITY BONUS (DB17-00001), involving the development of 24 three-story single-family residences each totaling between 1,925 and 2,243 square feet of living area and having a two-car garage. The proposal also includes two (2) three-story single-family residences which will each have an attached Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU), with each primary residence consisting of 1,464 square feet of living area and a two-car garage, and each ADU consisting of 1,134 square feet of living area and a two-car garage and will be deed restricted as affordable housing. The project is proposed at a 7.04-acre parcel located at 1902 Grandview Street (APN: 151-310-38) between Crouch Street and Hunsaker Street in the Fire Mountain Neighborhood Planning Area. *The Commission denied the project by a 7-0 vote. A resolution of denial will be reviewed by the Commission at a subsequent meeting, and upon adoption will start the appeal period.*

Public Works

Army Corps of Engineers Sediment Removal Project – The project has been cancelled by the Corps after having insurmountable issues with their low bid contractor. A letter from the City will be mailed out this week to the Corps expressing the City's frustration. Staff will ask for City resources to be reimbursed related to work on the bike trail detour route or at least to receive credit towards the City's cost share. Staff was also told the project will probably not be rescheduled until the fall of 2019 at the earliest or until the 902 funding limit is increased.

North River Road Repairs - On October 26-27, City staff will perform an asphalt overlay on the eastbound lane of North River Road from Wilshire Road to Sleeping Indian Road (approximately 0.5 miles). Staff will return November 1-2, to complete the west bound lane of North River Road from Sleeping Indian to Wilshire Road. Roadway notification signs have been placed to let residents know to expect delays and use alternative routes.

Alex Road Skate Park Repairs - Staff has hired a contractor to make repairs to the skate park ramps, bowls and other structures. The work will start on Monday, October 30 and the park will be closed for approximately 2 weeks.

San Luis Rey River Mowing — The work is moving along and the contractor has mowed approximately 60 acres to date. A total of 70 acres are to be mowed from College Boulevard to Pilgrim Creek about a mile west of Douglas Drive.



Economic Development

Target Store Opening – Target's new signage is up and they are expected to open on November 12. This single-level, 89,000-square-foot store is located in the Mission Marketplace shopping center located at 471 College Boulevard, near the north side of Highway 76. The store, which will be known as the Oceanside East Target, is the only new Target store opening this year in San Diego County. The store will include sundries, toys, electronics, clothing, food and seasonal items and will also services like a CVS Pharmacy and a Starbucks, and Target Mobile and order pickup, allowing customers to buy items online and pick them up in the store.

Revised Hearing Date for Water Rates - The hearing date has been moved from November 1 to December 6, 2017, in order to allow for the required 45-day notification period. If passed, the rates would then be adopted at the December 20 Council meeting, requiring 30 days before implementation and therefore extending the date of implementation to February 1, 2018.

Oceanside Solar Project update

Phase 1 - Fire Station 7, Bishop Park and the El Corazon Senior Center continue to move forward. The main focus of this phase now is the electrical connections. COC fencing removal won't happen until November 22.

Phase 2 – Consists of Fire Station 4 and 6, Jones Road, MLK Park and OPD headquarters. Fire Station 4 and 6 plans have been approved; Jones Road and MLK Park plans are in the plan review process by the Building Division. OPD plans were submitted and plan check comments should be received by the end of this week. The schedule issued by Primoris shows temporary fencing installation at Fire Station 4 and 6 on November 3 and November 7 respectively

and Jones Road fencing will be installed on November 6. OPD temporary fencing will be installed November 21 and MLK Park on November 21. This task has pushed a few days from the last update.
