CITY COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE November 30, 2017

Planning

Economic Development Element/General Plan Update - On November 29, the Planning Division conducted a public workshop on the draft framework of the Economic Development Element (EDE). The workshop was attended by roughly 40 members of the public, including Oceanside residents and business owners. Participants were introduced to the draft EDE themes, goals, and policies as well as relevant economic data gathered through technical studies and staff research. The themes, goals and policies are based on community input and the findings of the technical studies prepared to date.

At the workshop, presentations were provided by staff as well as the City's project consultant, Keyser Marston Associates. Following these presentations, public comments were received. Comments included: "economic development should enhance and not detract from the quality of life of Oceanside residents; natural amenities should be enhanced; hi-density nodes should be considered for major streets; airport should be better utilized as an economic development resource; assess North River Farms' impacts on agritourism; attract hi-tech companies; pursue cannabis commerce; support incubators in exchange for public benefits; goals and policies will only be useful if they are adhered to by decision-makers and if progress in achieving goals is measured in objective and quantitative terms." Several participants also asked questions regarding the fiscal impacts associated with various land use types of land uses (e.g., residential, hotels and industrial).

TWO CONDOS AT 829 S. PACIFIC STREET – Consideration of a TENTATIVE PARCEL MAP (P16-00001), DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D16-00004) and REGULAR COASTAL PERMIT (RC16-00006) to allow the construction of a two-unit condominium building at 829 South Pacific Street. *Staff is recommending approval.*

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Listed below are the public hearing items that the OHPAC will review at their meeting on Tuesday, December 5, 2017.

BOUTIQUE HOTEL AT 408 PIER VIEW WAY – Consideration of a Development Plan (RD17-00005), a Conditional Use Permit (RCUP17-00003), and a Regular Coastal Permit (RRP17-00007) to operate a boutique hotel with associated tenant improvements at 408 Pier View Way. *Staff is recommending CDC approval.*

SURFSIDE ANIMAL HOSPITAL EXPANSION AT 3870 MISSION AVENUE, SUITE D AND 3876 MISSION AVENUE – Consideration of DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D17-00016), CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP17-00018) and HISTORIC PERMIT (H16-00002) to allow the expansion of an existing animal hospital into an adjacent building/suite. A drive aisle between the buildings is proposed to be closed off with landscape planters and fencing for use as a pedestrian walkway for the business. *Staff is recommending Planning Commission approval.*

DISCUSSION ITEMS

--Local Coastal Program (LCP) Update

City Manager's Office

Buena Vista Lagoon Final EIR - SANDAG released the Final EIR on October 27, 2017, denoting the saltwater alternative as the proposed project. SANDAG staff indicate that the Final EIR is tentatively scheduled for certification by the SANDAG Board of Directors on January 26, 2018.

Public Works

Pier View Way Bridge Concrete
Patching Project – Work started
Monday, November 27 on the southwest
quadrant of the structure as the contractor
began installing fencing and
scaffolding. This is the last quadrant of
the structure to be completed and should
take approximately 3 months depending
on the extent of the repairs needed. This
work was delayed in order to stay out of
the area during the busy summer season.

Pier Deck Replacement Project – Work

will begin in mid-December on a deck replacement project at the end of the pier around Ruby's restaurant. This is the last portion of decking that needs to be replaced. The contractor will work in only one section at a time to be as least disruptive to Ruby's and its' patrons during the work as possible. Staff has spoken to Ruby's management about the project and method of work. The project should take approximately 2 months to complete.

North Coast Corridor Bikeshare Program - Staff from the Traffic Engineering Division has attended three coordination meetings with representatives from other regional cities. The meetings were an opportunity for cities to review the different types of Bikeshare programs currently available, and evaluate the feasibility of implementing a program along the north coast

corridor. At the last meeting, five coastal cities agreed to solicit comments and prepare an MOU for all five cities to sign (which will be brought to Council). All cities agreed that implementing the pilot program should be no cost to the cities. Encinitas has volunteered to take the lead in preparing the MOU and Request for Information; they hope to implement the program in their city by spring 2018. Staff from the Traffic Engineering Division will be giving an overview of the program to MainStreet Oceanside on December 5.

Oceanside Boulevard Repairs - On December 6 and 7, City staff will perform an asphalt overlay on the number 1 westbound lane of Oceanside Boulevard from Camelot to Crouch. Staff will return the following week, to complete the number 2 west bound lane. Roadway notification signs have been placed and social media will be updated to let residents know to expect delays and use alternative routes.

Oceanside Municipal Golf Course - The City has a vector remediation project that is scheduled for the golf course. The project would remove significant amounts of invasive vegetation and mosquito breeding areas, and reconfigure sections of Pilgrim Creek through the course. All of the creek crossings will be replaced and upgraded as part of the project. In order to effectively construct the project, the golf course would need to be either completely closed for a 6 month period, or partially closed for a 12 month period. Staff is evaluating the costs associated with various options including the timing and cost of upgrades to the golf course itself. Additional information on alternatives will be forthcoming.

Police Department

Body Cameras – OPD and I.T. currently have some of the computer servers installed at the Police Department to support the Body Worn Camera infrastructure. ARQ, the camera vendor, will be doing additional installations at OPD starting the week of Dec 11. There was a setback due to some equipment being held up at Customs. Staff projects the initial launch of the 20 camera trial period will begin on January 1, 2018.

Financial Services

Audit - The auditors have completed the audit of the City's financial records with no major issues found. The Comprehensive Annual Financial Report ("CAFR") is in process and will be presented to the Council at the December 20 meeting.

Water Utilities

Solar Project - The Solar project construction activity continues. This week into next week, scheduled power outages with SDG&E will take place at all 9 facilities. Safety service facilities will not have power interruptions due to on-site emergency generators. Other City facilities will be closed during the power outage.

MLK Park parking lot closure is scheduled for Tuesday, December 5. A phased parking lot closure plan has been developed at MLK Jr. Park to address user access, ADA access, and drop-off and pick-up scenarios for both schools. OUSD has been notified and will continue to receive updates to coordinate with students and parents.

Landfill Week - City of Oceanside residents will be able to have large items that are not suitable for donation picked up curbside during the upcoming Landfill Week. Landfill Week for single family residents is scheduled for December 4-8 and multifamily complexes between December 11 -15. To schedule a pick up, call Waste Management at 760 439-2824 at least 24 hours before your regularly scheduled service day.

Fire Department/Public Works

Tree Planting Dedicated to Fallen Heroes of 9/11 - As a dedication to the fallen heroes of 9/11, the Public Works Department, Fire Department, San Diego Regional Urban Forests Council, and Fire Explorers planted two Cypress trees replicating the "Twin Towers" at Fire Station No. 7 on Nov. 28, 2017. Remembering the brave men and women that sacrificed their lives for the protection of the citizens of New York City remains in the hearts of us all. This year, the Fire Explorers (a group of young men and women being trained in various aspects of the fire service) helped plant the two trees. The Fire Explorer program prepares participants for the competitive path to a career in the Fire Department.



Library

Bookmobile wraps - The Oceanside Public Library's Bookmobiles will be getting wrapped during the Holidays with colorful new graphics. In order to do this update, which was made possible by the generous support of the Friends of the Library and the Library Foundation, the vehicles will not be on the road during the month of December. The new vehicle wraps will be enjoyed when the bookmobiles are back serving the community in January.

Private Surf Camp Permits in Oceanside - Since 2015, the City began to designate certain areas for private Surf Camps on Oceanside beaches. The City required these surf camps to submit an application, provide its business license and proof of insurance and obtain a permit to operate the camp from the Parks & Recreation Administration Office. Fees are expected to go up slightly in 2018 to ensure cost recovery. This will move the City towards a more sustainable cost recovery model. The financial impact to the camps should be minimal.
