CITY COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE April 14, 2016

Planning

FACTORY OF DREAMS – Consideration of an ADMINISTRATIVE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (ACUP15-00008) for a request to allow special events to occur, such as, weddings, quinceaneras, conferences, receptions, and other banquet activities held within an existing 10,000-square-foot commercial suite located at 318 North Horne Street. *The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution as revised. The call for review/appeal period ends on April 21, 2016.*

ARCO CARWASH – Consideration of a DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D15-00023) and CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP15-00025) to allow the construction of an approximate 1,050-square-foot automated drive-thru carwash with associated site improvements located at 3804 Plaza Drive. The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on April 21, 2016.

Public Works

Proposed Hours of Closure for Municipal Pier – Public Works and OPD brought an item to the Parks and Recreation Commission on Tuesday, April 12 asking for a recommendation to City Council to introduce an ordinance to establish new closure hours in City Parks, as well as establish closure hours for the pier, pier ramps and pier park areas. The item was approved. In an effort to eliminate overnight camping and unwanted activity on the pier, staff will request to post signs and install a locking gate at the beginning of the wood portion of the pier to close every night from 11:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m. The gate would allow people to exit during closure hours but not enter. Staff researched other piers in Southern California to determine their hours of operation and several cities already close their pier overnight. This issue has been discussed with both tenants on the pier (Ruby's, Pier Bait Store) and both are supportive of this action. The pier would be closed each night after Ruby's restaurant closes and would reopen each day at 4:00 a.m. when City beach maintenance staff reports to work. An ordinance will be brought forward to City Council in the near future asking for approval of the closure hours.

Engineering

Annual Overlay-On El Camino Real, the City's contractor is adjusting utilities, finishing striping, and replacing traffic detector loops. To avoid traffic conflicts, most of the work is done at night.

Surfrider Way and Pacific Street-The contractor is adjusting utilities, finishing striping, and replacing traffic detector loops. The contractor will also clean up the asphalt emulsion that was tracked on to adjacent streets.

The Strand at Wisconsin Street-The City's contractor will complete concrete curb and gutter work south of the intersection. The intersection and the southerly portion of grinding and paving is scheduled to be done next week.
