Neighborhood Services

Oceanside Deployment Site for WeALLCOUNT census of homeless persons on Friday, January 27, 2017 at the El Corazon Senior Center - The Regional Task Force on the Homeless (RTFH) coordinates an annual one-day census of the people in San Diego County experiencing homelessness, both sheltered and unsheltered; more than 1,000 volunteers will be trained and deployed throughout the county. The count is mandated for all communities funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. It enables our region to better understand the scope, impact and potential solutions to homelessness, and empowers our community to qualify for funding that is essential to addressing the issue. Communities across the country will be conducting similar events during the last ten days of January. This year the count will take place on Friday, January 27, 2017 between 4:00 and 7:00 a.m.

For the fourth year, the City of Oceanside will host a deployment center at the El Corazon Senior Center, located at 3302 Senior Center Drive. Volunteers will arrive at 4:00 a.m. and be provided with maps of areas that they will survey. Results of the survey will be published by the Task Force at a later date. Public Works

Beach Sand – The City was able to obtain 2,500 cubic yards of free sand from a contractor at Camp Pendleton. It continues to be delivered to Buccaneer Beach. The City had recently received the final Opportunistic Beach Fill Program (OBFP) permit which will allow us to take advantage of any appropriate sand generated from construction throughout the city. The material at Del Mar Beach was inspected to ensure it was clean, beach quality sand. The contractor not only delivered the sand, but also provided a flagman on site and spread the material on the beach, at no City cost.



Water Utilities

Curb Up - Waste Management, in partnership with Goodwill, have enhanced "Curb Up" reuse options for residents and multi-family complexes, to include additional "donation weeks" during the year, donation kiosks, and additional services for textile recycling in 2017. A "Curb Up" zero waste service sheet will be sent in the January billing to all residents. Direct mailers will also be sent to multi-family complex owners/managers in order to promote the proper reuse, recycling, and disposal of large item bulk materials. Information here:

Organics Feasibility Study - As part of the City's Organics Feasibility Study, a Waste Characterization Study will be conducted at the City Operations Center from Monday, January 16 to Friday, January 20, weather permitting. Staff from Waste Management, HF&H Consultants, and the City Zero Waste team will be analyzing solid waste, recycling, and organics streams from all residential and commercial collection routes. Additionally, stakeholder meetings will be conducted on January 30 to evaluate various local processing options and costs for organics materials.

Agritoutism - The Tier 1 Strategy of the Agritourism Strategic Plan will kick off with the first Agritourism Workshop to be held at Melba Bishop Park on January 31 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Speakers include the State-renowned Penny Leff, the UC Davis Small Farms Programs and Agritourism Coordinator. She will discuss potential agritourism projects and programs that could benefit Oceanside.

The Workshop will have small group discussions to share what individuals would like to do on their farms and the ability to share their experiences or hesitations.

The Agenda also includes city staff from Planning, Traffic, Water/Sewer and Engineering, as well as a County environmental health representative to discuss the regulations and requirements needed to make agritourism ideas a reality. The presentations will feature speakers that have had success in opening agritourism venues like the Temecula Olive Oil Company, Mellano Farms, and others to be confirmed. Penny Leff will close by having participants assess their agritourism

potential and discuss the paths, steps and improvements or changes needed to accomplish agritourism development.

This is a free event sponsored by the City of Oceanside in partnership with Visit Oceanside and the South Morro Hills Association. Both breakfast and lunch will be provided from agritourism partners that source their produce and supplies locally: breakfast from Petite Madeline and lunch supplied by Local Tap House.
