CITY COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE April 9, 2015

Planning

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission reviewed and took action on at their meeting on Tuesday, April 7, 2015.

SWAJIAN ADDITION – Adoption of Planning Commission Resolution No. 2015-P09 denying without prejudice REGULAR COASTAL PERMIT (RC14-00008) and VARIANCE (V14-00009) to allow an addition to an existing single-family residence at 1825 South Pacific Street. *The Commission adopted the resolution by a 7-0 vote. The call for review/appeal period ends on April* 17, 2015.

IVY RIDGE ESTATES – Consideration of TENTATIVE TRACT MAP (T14-00004), CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP14-00013), and DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D14-00007) involving the development of five two-story single-family residences each totaling between 2,988 and 3,188 square feet and having a three-car garage. *The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on April 17, 2015.*

VERIZON @ 428 SLEEPING INDIAN ROAD – Consideration of DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D13-00015) and CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP13-00033) to allow construction and operation of a new wireless telecommunications facility at 428 Sleeping Indian Road, Oceanside, California. *The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on April 17, 2015.*

Building

The Building Division will be holding an all-day solar permitting seminar in the City Council Chambers on Tuesday, May 12, 2015. This interactive training event is designed for government and industry professionals to learn to apply solar guidelines consistently with electrical, structural, building and fire codes to help simplify the permitting process.

Harbor Dredging

Manson Construction has begun mobilization of piping and equipment necessary for the dredging project, now scheduled to commence on April 9 due to a delay in the arrival of the dredging vessel. The piping that will be used to move the sand is now in place across Harbor Beach to the area of North Coast Village. Piping is also in place near Surfrider Way with more deployment to follow. The daily volume of sand to be pumped is estimated by Manson Construction to be between 18,000 to 25,000 cubic yards based upon sea and other conditions. The contractor is planning to begin depositing sand in the vicinity of the Pier on April 13; the area where the sand is to be deposited will be fenced. The contractor's demobilization is expected to be completed by May 1.
