CITY COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE April 16, 2015

Planning

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission will review at their meeting on Monday, April 20, 2015.

T-MOBILE @ 2183 VISTA WAY – Consideration of a CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP14-00028) to construct three radio frequency-transparent enclosures atop the existing commercial building at 2183 Vista Way. *Staff is recommending approval.*

KCS PROPERTIES LLC – Consideration of Regular Coastal Permits (RC12-00020) and (RC12-00021) involving the development of two new single-family detached dwellings on two parcels currently developed with one single-family dwelling. The subject property is located at 1631 S. Pacific Street. *Staff is recommending approval.*

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION – Consideration of a ZONE AMENDMENT (ZA12-00005) and LOCAL COASTAL PLAN AMENDMENT (LCPA12-00003) incorporating provisions for reasonable accommodation into the 1992 Zoning Ordinance and the implementing document of the City's Local Coastal Program (i.e., the 1986 Zoning Ordinance). The proposed zoning text amendments would add Section 3043 "Reasonable Accommodation" to the 1992 Zoning Ordinance. The proposed action is meant to allow for modifications or exceptions to land use and zoning rules, policies, and practices when necessary to provide individuals with disabilities with an equal opportunity to use and enjoy a dwelling unit. *Staff is recommending approval.*

Earth Festival 2015 - April 19 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. in downtown Oceanside (Sunset Market footprint). Enjoy environmental organizations, entertainment, and hands-on activities. The event features a Vintage Market area, Home Improvement Zone, a Kid's Ecozone, and is expected to see over 5,000 guests making it the largest Earth Festival in North County. Additionally, thanks to a major sponsorship by the Rincon Band of Luiseno Indians, KPRI will be hosting the stage area live on radio and will be providing several professional musicians to headline (Gabriela Aparico, Paul Cannon, and Josh Domingo). Tribal leaders may be on hand to commemorate the event and their support for Green Oceanside. KPRI is also airing daily radio spots about the Festival and other Earth month opportunities. Earth Day – Oceanside in the News - On April 22, Fox 5 News will be highlighting Oceanside's Earth Month events and the City's efforts towards zero waste, live on the morning news. Fox 5 will air 3 segments of interviews between 6:00 - 9:00 a.m. The segments will feature the Oceanside Zero Waste Green Team student ambassadors, public recycling and litter pick up by H20 Trash Patrol, Green Oceanside Business Network members Local Tap House, organic farming, composting, and host Joel Greene from *Curiosity Quest Goes Green*. Tune in to Fox 5 to see Oceanside shine as a green leader in San Diego County.

National Launch of *Curiosity Quest Goes Green* on San Diego Channel 4 and KPBS National and MLK Middle School Assembly - During the week of Earth Day, April 22, 2015, San Diego Channel 4 and PBS National will be airing a new episode of *Curiosity Quest Goes Green*, featuring the City of Oceanside and Oceanside's Zero Waste Schools Green Team Ambassadors as they answer the question, "How do we keep our beaches clean?" To celebrate the show's launch and Oceanside's role, the City of Oceanside's Zero Waste team is partnering with OUSD to reward the dedication of the 750+ student Green Ambassadors that support the Zero Waste Schools Program. These students will attend a special assembly at Martin Luther King Middle School (1290 Ivy Ranch Rd.) in which Joel Greene, host of PBS Children's show *Curiosity Quest Goes Green,* will talk about the important role they play in promoting Zero Waste. The students will come from the 9 OUSD schools in which the Zero Waste Schools Program has been implemented (Palmquist Elementary, South Oceanside Elementary, McAuliffe Elementary, Del Rio Elementary, Mission Elementary, Ivey Ranch Elementary, Santa Margarita k-8, Lincoln Middle School and Martin Luther King Middle School). OUSD is the first district in the nation to formally adopt the goal of 75%-90% waste diversion by 2020. Fire Mountain "Love Your Planet" Zero Waste Celebration - April 25, 10 a.m. - 12 p.m. at the Palmquist Elementary School Garden. The City's Zero Waste Team will be celebrating the completion of Fire Mountain's pilot "Love Your Planet" community challenge. Over 25 households in the Fire Mountain community participated in an 8 week intensive Zero Waste lifestyle program. Through 8 home-based workshops, Solid Waste and Recycling staff, along with staff and volunteers from the Solana Center, taught Fire Mountain families how to incorporate tangible environmental solutions into their everyday lives and households. The program encompassed lessons on waste reduction, reuse, recycling, backyard composting, water conservation, and home energy savings. Participants were required to hold baseline audits on their home resource use and waste, and then undergo follow-up audits, along with routine checks on their food waste composting progress. To celebrate these families' hard work and commitment, the Zero Waste team will be hosting a celebration/program overview luncheon from 10:00 a.m. to noon, at the Palmquist Elementary School Garden on Saturday, April 25. This program reached over 200 residents through home family/neighbor education, and will serve as a continuing model for similar program implementation in other Oceanside communities.
