Public Works

Citywide LED Street Light Retrofit Project: Southern Contracting will begin replacing approximately 7,700 street lights on Monday, August 25. The new LED lights will be approximately 70% more efficient than the existing high-pressure sodium lights. This first phase of the project will take about 4 months and work will begin in the Jeffries Ranch neighborhood. The second phase of the project will begin in early 2015 after completion of the first phase and will include parking lot lighting in the Downtown area, Harbor, City parks and other City facilities.
