VERIZON @ PMCU – Consideration of a CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP13-00031) to allow the establishment and operation of a wireless telecommunication facility attached to the roof of an existing financial building located at 1278 Rocky Point Drive. *The Commission approved the project by a 6-0 vote (Rosales – Absent) and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on November 13, 2014.*

MORSE STREET TOWNHOMES – Consideration of a TENTATIVE MAP (T13-00008), CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP13-00009), DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D13-00004) and REGULAR COASTAL PERMIT (RC13-00003) involves the development of a 38-unit residential townhome community on a 2.3-acre vacant parcel at the northeast corner of Coast Highway and Morse Street. *The Commission approved the project by a 6-0 vote (Rosales – Absent) and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on November 13, 2014.*

Zero Waste Facilities & America Recycles Day - November 15

This November, in celebration of America Recycles Day, the City of Oceanside's Zero Waste team will be working with Parks and Recreation staff to get the Recreation and Senior Center facilities on the Road to Zero Waste. This is part of the continuing effort to Zero Waste in all City facilities in support of our commitment to reach 75-90% diversion from landfill by 2020. The Zero Waste team will be conducting audits to design waste and recycling systems that best fit the needs and programs of each community Park and Recreation facility, including the two Senior Centers. Each facility will receive the mini trash bin and recycling "buddy system" for administrative areas and common areas. Additionally, each facility will receive reusable plates, silverware, cups, and dishwashers (if needed) to use for staff events, courtesy of the Water Utilities Solid Waste program. To launch the program and secure staff buy-in, each facility will receive a "Zero Waste Break" to educate staff, volunteers and community partners regarding Zero Waste benefits, goals, and procedures. The Zero Waste events are scheduled for the week of November 17. Since the inception of the Zero Waste facility program in 2013, the City has realized additional cost savings through enhanced recycling and waste reduction strategies.
