Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission will review at their meeting on Monday, December 15, 2014.

WERMERS DECK EXPANSION – Consideration of a REGULAR COASTAL PERMIT (RC14-00012) for an open patio deck expansion along the rear basement level of an existing single-family residence located at 1949 S. Pacific Street. ***Staff is recommending approval.***

PREMIERE PATIO PROPANE – Consideration of a CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP14-00010) to allow the installation and use of two 30,000-gallon above ground and outdoor propane storage tanks at 3231-B Oceanside Boulevard. ***Staff is recommending approval.***

AT&T @ 2225 MISSION AVE. – Consideration of a CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP13-00026) to allow the establishment and operation of a wireless tele-communication facility attached to the roof of an existing AT&T fleet maintenance and office building located at 2225 Mission Avenue. ***Staff is recommending approval.***
