T-MOBILE @ 3825 MISSION AVENUE – Consideration of CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP12-00035), a request for approval to allow for equipment upgrades and the continued operation of a wireless communications facility located at 3825 Mission Avenue. *The Commission approved the project by a 6-0 vote (Balma – Absent) and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on May 2, 2013.*

T-MOBILE @ 2185 VISTA WAY – Consideration of a CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP12-00037), a request for approval to allow for equipment upgrades and the continued operation of a wireless communications facility located at 2185 Vista Way. **The Commission approved the project by a 6-0 vote (Balma – Absent) and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on May 2, 2013.**

SPRING CREEK SENIOR LIVING COMMUNITY – Consideration of a DEVELOPMENT PLAN (D12-00014), CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CUP12-00015), and VARIANCE (V12-0002) for the establishment and operation of an assisted living (96 units) and memory care (31 units) facility, on a property located west of Melrose Drive, at the terminus of The Depot Road within the Guajome Neighborhood Planning Area. *The Commission approved the project by a 6-0 vote (Balma – Absent) and adopted the resolution. The call for review/appeal period ends on May 2, 2013.*

EMBRY-RIDDLE AERONAUTICAL UNIVERSITY – Consideration of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP13-00004), a request to establish a private aviation and aerospace engineering school within an existing professional office building located at 3609 Ocean Ranch Boulevard. *The Commission approved the project by a 6-0 vote (Balma – Absent) and adopted the resolution.
