

COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

April 2, 2009

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission will review at their meeting on Monday, April 6, 2009:

Wings, Pizza n' Things Restaurant – To expand alcohol services to beer, wine and spirits in an existing eating and drinking establishment located at 4225 Oceanside Boulevard, Suite Z, within the Developers Resources Plaza Mottino Shopping Center, otherwise known as Rancho Del Oro Gateway. This item has been continued to the April 20, 2009, Planning Commission meeting.

Buena Vista Lagoon Trail Connector and Observation Decks – To permit the construction of a trail connector bridge and two observation decks along an existing nature trail located on the Buena Vista Lagoon Ecological Reserve at 2202 South Coast Highway. Staff is recommending approval.

Dillion Residence – To permit the remodel of an existing duplex and to extend two west facing balconies located at 1301 South Pacific Street. Staff is recommending approval.

Cingular Wireless – To allow a co-user communication facility disguised as chimneys and located on the roof of a house located at 6543 Indian Trails Way. Staff is recommending approval.

LOCAL CLINICS RECEIVE FUNDING AWARDS

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has announced grants to local community health centers under the Increased Demand for Services (IDS) of the Recovery Act of 2009. North County Health Services will receive \$1,085,331 and Vista Community Clinic will receive \$1,058,758 over the next two years; both agencies were among the top ten awards in the State of California. The funds will assist the clinics in providing primary and preventive medical services to persons who have lost health insurance and others who are turning to community clinics during the economic downturn.

HUD 2009-10 ACTION PLAN AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

The draft 2009-2010 Action Plan is now available for public review and comment; the Action Plan has information on the City's plans to use Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership and other federal funds to benefit low- and moderate-income individuals, families and neighborhoods during the next program year. Print copies of the Action Plan are available at the City Library, City Clerk's office, Neighborhood Services Department and the City Web site on the Housing Web page. The plan will be brought to the City Council on May 6, in a public hearing for approval and submission to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Annual Oceanside Harbor Dredging to Begin

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will begin the annual maintenance dredging of Oceanside Harbor on Thursday, April 2, 2009. The dredging is expected to take about two weeks. J.E. McAmis Inc. of Chico, California, will subcontract the dredging work to Manson Construction Company of Seattle, Washington. Manson will use the hydraulic dredge *H.R. Morris* to remove approximately 200,000 cubic yards of material from the approach channel and the entrance channels to Oceanside and Del Mar Channels. Scott John, the project manager with the Los Angeles District, said the dredging would keep the harbor entrance at a minimum depth of 20 feet. That depth will reduce the size of waves entering the harbor, protecting small craft moored there and providing safe passage for recreational boats, commercial fishing and military vessels. *Morris* will pump about 200,000 cubic yards of sand a two-foot diameter pipeline and place it on or near the beach south of the Oceanside Pier, helping to protect and restore them. The U.S. Navy and the Corps of Engineers are funding the dredging project, which is the third year of a three-year contract. The operation will be monitored around-the-clock to ensure the safety of residents and visitors. Residents are requested to remind their children that it is dangerous to play around the outflow pipe.
