

COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

June 11, 2009

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission reviewed and took action on at their meeting on Monday, June 8, 2009:

Vine Street Commercial – To construct a 13,574-square-foot grocery market with an attached 3,000-square-foot retail suite on a 1.878-acre parcel located at the northwest corner of Vine Street and Oceanside Boulevard. The Commission approved the project by a 5-0 vote and adopted the resolution; call for review/appeal period ends on June 18, 2009.

South Pacific Street Remodel – To allow for the addition of 1,144 square feet of living space and a 260-square foot deck to an existing single-family residence located at 1733 South Pacific Street. The Commission approved the project by a 5-0 vote and adopted the resolution; call for review/appeal period ends on June 18, 2009.

Administrative Approval

Barajas Room Addition – For an 800-square-foot addition to an existing single-family residence located at 1509 Marquette Street. Administrative approval on June 9, 2009 and the appeal period ends on June 19, 2009.

EL CORAZON SENIOR CENTER GRAND OPENING

City/OCSP application for funding

The City/OCSP application for funding for the \$400,000 Earmark awarded to the City for Gang Prevention activities is currently being completed for submission to the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. This earmark is a result of the City's lobbying efforts and its work with the Ferguson Group, our federal lobbyist. Due to the current economic conditions, the bulk of the funding is needed to maintain youth

programs which are at risk due to the loss/reduction in State, County and private funding currently being experienced by our non-profit partners and the City. This funding will help us maintain the following programs during the grant period which will run from October 1, 2009 through June 30, 2011:

- North County Lifeline After School Programs at the Crown Heights and San Luis Rey Valley Community Resource Centers. County funding for this program ends effective 6-30-09. The programs will be able to continue on allocated CDBG funding until this grant begins on October 1, and will then be funded through 6-30-11.
- Interfaith Community Services' Transitional Youth Academy (TYA) Program which serves at-risk youth in Oceanside. This program relies heavily on donations from corporations/private donors and these have dropped substantially in the current economic circumstances. Funding will help maintain services through June 30, 2011. Interfaith also operates the Working Pirates Program at Oceanside High School which is funded through a Workforce Investment Act grant through the San Diego Workforce Partnership and TYA is an important piece of the youth services/gang prevention effort in Oceanside.
- Funding is also requested for OCSP Youth and Family Outreach events and expenses and that will help support our partnership with the SOS group and the Saturday night mentoring program at Melba Bishop Recreation Center.
- The maintenance and fuel costs of one of the Neighborhood Services Recreation vans will be covered in this grant as that vehicle is used by the programs supported under the grant.
- Some funding is requested for temporary staff time to upgrade the OCSP Web site and to provide training to community partners that will enable them to easily access and update their information on the site.
- Funding for staff training required by the grant, and administrative costs are also included in the budget request.

Records Retention Program update

The Citywide Records Retention Program approved by the City Council last November is now in use by City departments and the City Clerk Records Center. This program provides a standardized filing system for use by all City departments and it gives guidance for identifying documents that record the history of the City and daily operations and projects.

It provides a mechanism for determining what must be retained to comply with existing laws and operational or historical needs while allowing the removal of superseded material.

Pier View Undercrossing

Public Works will begin a project to re-stain and re-seal the Pier View Undercrossing in Downtown Oceanside. The work is typically done every 2-3 years due to the harsh environment conditions and heavy pedestrian, bicycle and skateboard traffic. The project will take approximately eight working days to complete and should get started by the end of next week. Only one side of the crossing will be closed at a time so

access will be maintained and the project will be completed before the July 4th weekend.
