Planning Commission/Community Workshop on Monday, October 12, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. Discussion Item:

<u>Presentation on What Makes Transfer of Development Rights?</u>: <u>Success Factors From Research and Practice Concept by Rick Pruetz, AICP</u>

The purpose of the Planning Commission workshop is to inform Oceanside decision makers, staff and the general public on issues related to the planning concept of Transfer of Development Rights (TDR) that is anticipated to be utilized in the implementation of the Coast Highway Vision and Strategic Plan area. A presentation on the subject matter will be made by Mr. Rick Pruetz, AICP. In 1999, Mr. Pruetz began a consulting practice specializing in transfer of development rights and related planning/preservation tools. To date, he has prepared TDR studies and/or ordinances for more than 20 communities including Davis County, Utah, Santa Fe County, New Mexico and Livermore, California. Prior to 1999, he served as the City Planner of Burbank, California for over 14 years and worked as a planner for Waukesha, Wisconsin and Camp Dresser McKee. He holds a Master of Urban Planning degree from the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee. In 2004, he was honored as a Fellow of the American Institute of Certified Planners.

In addition to the preparation of TDR studies and ordinances, he has conducted numerous workshops and presentations on TDR throughout the US. He has written several articles and papers about TDR as well as two other TDR books including *Saved By Development* the predecessor of *Beyond Takings and Givings*.

Recovery Act Reports

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 requires that all recipients of Recovery Act funds submit quarterly reports no later than ten days following the end of each quarter. The City receives Recovery Act funds through the Community Development Block Grant - Recovery Act (CDBG-R) Program and the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP).
