# April 11, 2008

## **Planning Commission Meeting**

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission reviewed and took action on at their meeting on Monday, April 7, 2008:

King of Kings Lutheran Church -- To replace two existing 1,750 square foot buildings with one new 6,200 square foot Fellowship Hall building and to add a 598 square foot addition to the existing Nursery of a church located at 2993 MacDonald Street. The project will also include a 525 square foot expansion to the Administrative Offices and a 600 square foot addition to the existing Narthex. *The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution and the call for review/appeal period ends on April 17, 2008.* 

Guajome Regional Park Communication Facility Master Plan -- For the construction of a stand-alone communication facility, two co-user communication facilities, and for construction above the height limit. The project is also proposing to construct three monopoles disguised as trees with heights between 59 feet and 63 feet and to construct a 2,006 square foot equipment shelter for ancillary communication equipment. *This item has been continued to the PC meeting on May 5, 2008.* 

La Pacifica II -- To allow the construction of three industrial buildings with a total of 242,275 square feet in size located east of Rancho Del Oro Road and south of Ocean Ranch Boulevard on Lot 11 of the Ocean Ranch Corporate Center. *The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution and the call for review/appeal period ends on April 17, 2008.* 

Community Lutheran Church -- For the development of a 26,345 square foot religious facility with associated offices and school buildings located at 4507 Mission Avenue, on the southwest corner of Mission Avenue and Valley Heights Drive. *The Commission approved the project by a 6-0-1 vote and adopted the resolution and the call for review/appeal period ends on April 17, 2008.* 

# **Harbor Dredging**

The pumping of sand on the beach south of Tyson Street ended Wednesday April 9<sup>th</sup> with the completion of our annual Harbor Maintenance Dredging. The contractor "Manson Construction" should have all the pipe and equipment including the dredge removed by Friday April 18, or at the latest, by April 25.

Over 140,000 cubic meters of sand was removed from the mouth and entrance to both our Harbor and the Camp Pendleton Del Mar Boat Basin. The 140,000 cubic meters equates to 181,113 cubic yards; however, both of these numbers will more than likely increase after the final survey is completed later today.

#### **Center City Golf Course Alternative Study**

Staff issued an RFP for consultant services in early February for a baseline economic alternative use study for the Center City property. A proposal submitted by Economic Research Associates (ERA) of Los Angeles was selected by staff. ERA assisted the City with financial analysis of the El Corazon effort among other work this firm has done in the region. Finalization and award of the consultant contract is expected in May in an amount less than \$50,000, with consultant work to be completed by December 2008. A Town Meeting style forum will be held within the next two months as a way for citizens to express their views about possible alternative uses for the property.

#### Oceanside Boulevard Corridor Vision Plan Update

A request for proposals (RFP) was issued in January inviting consultants to support staff's outreach to corridor property owners. A proposal submitted by Bay Area-based Strategic Economics in collaboration with Denver-based Citiventure has been selected. Staff is currently finalizing the scope of work and fees and expects to award a contract by early May in an amount not to exceed \$50,000. Their work will focus on assisting

staff in obtaining property owner understanding and financial support for the preparation of a specific plan and environmental review for this corridor. Work should be completed by September and a decision on how to fund and move forward with the specific plan effort will follow thereafter.
