

## **COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE**

**April 17, 2008**

### **Planning Commission Meeting**

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission will review at their meeting on Monday, April 21, 2008:

Sandy Beach Residence -- For the demolition of one residential structure which is part of the El Sereno Cottages and located within the 800 block of South Pacific Street.

***Staff recommends approval.***

Sunset View Residence -- For the demolition of three residential units that are part of the El Sereno Cottages and located within the 800 block of South Pacific Street. ***Staff recommends approval.***

South Pacific Street Residence -- To allow for the demolition of a 2,196 square foot single family residence and construct a new 6,859 square foot single family residence with a three-car garage located at 1611 South Pacific Street. ***Staff recommends approval.***

Oceanside Wings, LLC -- For the addition of spirits (hard liquor) to the existing beer and wine services at Hooters Restaurant located at 3186 Vista Way. ***Staff recommends approval.***

### **April 20th drug-free event**

The North Coastal Prevention Coalition (NCPC) will host the "4/20 Remix" this coming Sunday afternoon from 2:00 to 6:00 pm at the Oceanside Pier and Amphitheater to counter the unofficial designation of the day as a time to smoke marijuana. The event will promote a healthy and drug-free lifestyle for youth and adults with a battle of the bands, climbing wall and booths from a variety of organizations. The "anti-420" program developed by the NCPC has been recognized by the Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America (CADCA) as an outstanding program; CADCA has recommended that member coalitions replicate the program on April 20 throughout the nation. The NCPC, serves residents of Oceanside, Carlsbad and Vista.

### **MLK, Jr. Scholarship Applications**

Fifty-four graduating high school seniors from nine different public, private and charter high schools have submitted applications for the 2008 City of Oceanside – Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Program. This is a record number of applications for the program, which was established by the City Council in 1989; scholarships were first awarded in 1991. The program is open to graduating high school seniors who live in Oceanside, regardless of which high school they attend or where they plan to attend college. The program is funded entirely by donations from members of the community and business and corporate sponsors; no public funds are used for the scholarships. The primary fund-raiser is an annual garden reception on the first Friday in June from 5:00 to 8:00

pm, at which the scholarship recipients are introduced; tickets for the June 6, 2008, event will be available in May. The Community Relations Commission, which manages the program, anticipates awarding \$50,000 in scholarships this year, depending upon the level of community support.

### **Faith in Action Day**

On Saturday, April 26th New Song Church will be leading a volunteer "Faith In Action" day with other churches from the area. Projects planned for Oceanside include interior painting of the Teen REACH space at Libby Lake Community Center; assisting Neighborhood Services and residents with neighborhood cleanups in Crown Heights, Libby Lake and on Arthur Avenue in the Valley; performing cleanup activities at Oceanside High School; and painting at Brother Benno's and the Bread of Life shelter. Volunteers will also be helping with the Dia De Los Ninos event in Eastside and the Creek to Bay Cleanup event along Loma Alta Creek. English as a Second Language (ESL) instructors from the program at Crown Heights Resource Center plan to teach a class for volunteer ESL instructors at New Song Church that day so that they can volunteer to teach classes during the year. Volunteers are also being encouraged to work with the children and teens at Casa De Amparo for the day and longer term volunteers are being recruited for that site.

The Pregnancy Resource Center will also receive volunteer assistance with data entry, cleaning, and distributing information.
