

COUNCIL WEEKLY UPDATE

October 9, 2008

Planning Commission Meeting

Listed below are the public hearing items that the Planning Commission reviewed and took action on at their meeting on Monday, October 6, 2008:

Lil Jackson -- To create two lots and construct an 80-unit residential structure located in the 3800 block of Lake Boulevard. The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution; call for review/appeal period ends on October 16, 2008.

Sprint @ SDG&E Substation -- For the construction and operation of a stand-alone communication facility located at 801 El Camino Real. The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution; call for review/appeal period ends on October 16, 2008.

Windstar Ocean Ranch Lot 19 -- To allow for the construction of 12 industrial buildings on Lot 19 of the Ocean Ranch Corporate Center located east of Rancho Del Oro Road and north of Ocean Ranch Boulevard. The parcel map would place each building on a single lot, with the parking lot and open space as one common lot. The proposed buildings would have a total square footage of 220,600 square feet. The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution; call for review/appeal period ends on October 16, 2008.

Oceanside Pavilion -- For the development of a 950,000 square foot shopping center on a 92-acre site located at the northeast corner of Foussat Road and State Route 76. The Commission approved the project by a 7-0 vote and adopted the resolution; call for review/appeal period ends on October 16, 2008.

Oceanside Public Library Wins PR Award

The California Library Association (CLA) has announced the winners of the 2008 PR Excellence Awards competition, and the Library's "Splash" mascot marketing campaign took First Place in the category of libraries with budgets of \$5-\$10 million. This award honors the highest quality efforts of California Libraries in promoting and communicating their message to their customers. CLA will honor award winners during the annual conference in San Jose on November 14. The most creative entry, the Best in Show Award, will be presented during the awards banquet. The "Splash" marketing materials included an "Early Learning for Families" brochure, a "My First Library Card" photo folder, bookmark and "Where's Splash?" contest, which were designed to establish a recognizable and popular branding for the Library's services to children and families.

Library Concert

Mariachi Reyna de Los Angeles, featuring America's first all female Mariachi ensemble, will perform at the Star Theatre on October 18, as part of the Library's World Music concert series. Tickets are \$15 for all ages and are available at the Library. The concert begins at 7:30 p.m., and it is open seating.

Multilingual Book Fair

The Library will host a Multilingual Book Fair on October 24 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the Civic Center Library Community Rooms. The Book Fair is sponsored by the Serra Cooperative Library System, and is open to librarians, teachers and the public. Vendors will have a large selection of material in several languages including Spanish, French, Chinese, Arabic, Tagalog and more. Orders may be placed and books will be shipped. Admission is free.

Oceanside Housing Authority

The Section 8 Housing Voucher Program completed the Section 8 Management Assessment Program certification and has been rated as a *high performer* by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The Assessment identifies the Housing Authority's capabilities and deficiencies related to the administration of the Section 8 Program.
